His adversaries would have liked him to believe that he was finished, but Paul knew otherwise. "If God is for [me], who can be against [me]" (Romans 8:31, NKJV)? "Who can bring a charge against [me]" (8:33)? Who can condemn [me]? (v.34) Who shall separate [me] from the love of Christ" (v.35)? "He... has determined [my] time and the boundaries of [my] dwellings... In Him [I] live and move and have [my] being" (Acts 17:26, 28).

Rather than resign to the lie, Paul trusted that his chains were Christ's means of accomplishing in and through him what his circumstances outside of prison could never do.
